Associate Vice President of K-16 Initiatives, University of Texas at Arlington

As Associate Vice President of K-16 Initiatives, I direct the university-wide efforts for K-16 education. The work of the University of Texas at Arlington's K-16 Leadership Council has been to act as a civic vehicle comprised of university vice presidents, deans and faculty as well as K-12 educators, 2 year college representatives and business and community leaders. The Council is committed to the goals of increasing success rates and closing the gaps in achievement among all students, kindergarten through graduate school, with a particular focus on providing access and success for low-income, African American, and Latino students. Preparing teachers and administrators at all educational levels, focusing on PK-20 curriculum alignment, and conducting formative and summative research are the UTA Council's major areas of excellence. The P-16 Doctoral Program housed within the College of Education and Health Professions is the only doctoral program in the US that prepares leaders at all levels (K-16) to conduct research and develop policy across K-12, 2year college, and university levels.
