Spring semester means summer lab planning is in full bloom. During the spring semester, CSI students are busy taking the prerequisites classes for the summer labs. They are learning the foundational information needed to come to campus and complete the hands-on labs for what they will be taught about this semester.

Students must currently be enrolled in the summer lab prerequisite courses (CJE 4241 and CJE 4135), to take the summer 2022 labs. This will also be a time when students must be checking their FSU email regularly!

Summer labs are not normal courses. They require a great deal of planning on the part of the instructors and the student. The need to purchase uniforms, order

PPE, set up travel, complete prelab assignments and other responsibilities will necessitate students pay attention to communications, so nothing is missed.

If you are not already in the Canvas CSI organization site, you should receive an invitation to join in the next couple of weeks. Accept this invite. We use this site to relay summer lab information, including dates, travel, uniforms, travel assistance and prelab assignments.

If you have any questions or need a recommendation do not hesitate to reach out to me. GO NOLES!


