CSI Major and FSU Marching Chief!

F-L-O-R-I-D-A S-T-A-T-E! My name is Georgia Glotzbach, I was born in Tallahassee and raised as a Seminole. My mother is an alumnus and even though my dad didn't graduate from FSU, but UF, he is still a Seminole fan. I grew up wearing garnet and gold, was able to sing and yell the fight song with the FSU Marching Chiefs at a very young age, and this past year I was given the amazing opportunity of being able to perform as one of them in the packed and most times sold out stands of Doak Campbell Stadium.

In high school, I was a part of the band as a member of the color guard and absolutely loved it. I loved being able to perform and see the joy that people got from watching us. After high school the next best option was FSU's winter guard, because I wasn't allowed to audition for Chiefs since I attended Tallahassee Community College and was not actively enrolled in FSU. The FSU winter guard allowed students to participate even if they did not attend FSU, as the skill level for performance was much higher and more competitive. After I graduated

with my AA I started at FSU PC as a distance learner in the Crime Scene Investigation program, and since FSU PC is considered a Florida State campus, I was able to submit my audition to the Marching Chiefs with special approval from the FSU athletic band director and my advisor.

When I say being a Marching Chief was a full-time commitment, it is not an exaggeration. Auditions were in April and practices for the Fall 2022 season began in May, however starting in August they were every day from 4 -6pm with the entire band, and occasionally would go to 7 sometimes 8pm with just the color guard. Game days were on a whole different level with the Marching Chiefs. Depending on the time of the game; for example, a noon kickoff, we were required to be on the practice field in full uniform for morning warmup at 7am. We will practice for an hour and a half, get a 30minute break, and then the band will march into the Stadium and start preparing for pre-game.

Being able to run onto the field with the entire band in a sold-out stadium for pre-game is something I will never be able to form into words. It is one of the most exhilarating feelings in the world, and it is what makes all the hard work and

time totally worth it. The first game I ever performed with the Marching Chiefs was in the Superdome in New Orleans against LSU and the last was at the Cheez-It Bowl against Oklahoma; both games were close calls, but the Seminoles turned out victorious in the end.

My time as a Marching Chief has given me so many amazing memories. All the long days and long nights of going to practice and staying up to finish homework afterwards were worth it. I performed in front of 75,000+ cheering fans, took pictures with people, traveled as a team; there is just nothing like it. This was the opportunity of a lifetime, and I am so grateful I was able to be a part of it now that I have graduated. MCATDT! Go Noles!
