Message From a CSI Alumni

I graduated from the FSU CSI program in August of 2019, and while in the program I interned at the Chief Inspector General for the Executive Office of the Governor and the Leon County Sheriff's Office Crime Scene Unit. Just before graduating I landed a full-time job as a Commission Investigator with the Florida Commission on Offender Review. As a Commission Investigator I worked in clemency and investigated convicted felon's background to determine if they were eligible for restoration of civil rights, firearm authority, remission of fines and forfeitures, or a full pardon based on the Governor's rules. While I wasn't working in forensics specifically, this position helped me gain a better understanding of the criminal justice system as a whole.

Just recently I accepted a position as a Forensic Specialist with the Tallahassee Police Department, and I am excited to start my career in forensics. While I was interning with the Leon County Sheriff's Office, I learned about their Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) task force that works with other counties and Homeland Security. This unit

exposed me to digital forensics and led me to pursue a master's degree in Information Technology. Through my position as a Forensic Specialist and working on my master's degree I hope to eventually lead into a more specialized forensic position.



My advice to future CSI students is to not only work hard in your classes, but to take the time to find an internship at an agency that you could find yourself working for. Take the time to learn as much as possible through the courses in the CSI program and to build your resume outside of the classroom as well. My experience and connections at my internships built professional relations that helped me find my jobs. In my case, I interned at the Chief Inspector General's Office for experience and not for credit in my major and it helped me obtain connections to get an interview

with the Florida Commission on Offender Review. Also, through experience going out into the field with the Leon County Sheriff's Office Crime Scene Unit and completing the Citizen's Police Academy at the Tallahassee Police Department, I was able to become a Forensic Specialist a year after graduating.

Another piece of advice is to prepare for an interview. Whether it be for an internship or a job, really familiarize yourself with the agency as much as possible. Think about the types of questions they will be asking you and prepare answers that will help them not only get to know how much you know, but what kind of professional you are as well.

Enjoy your time in the CSI program and being at FSU, it will go by faster than you thought.
