### FACULTY/STAFF/AUDIENCE INTRODUCTIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:

**Derrick Robinson, Prevention Specialist, Basic of NWFL:** Basic provides HIV services for HIV positive clients and provides prevention serves for Hep A and Hep C. They provide free testing and rapid testing and pass out protection to keep the community save from STD's. Bay County has 503 people living with HIV. It is important to know your status and your partner's status.

**Dr. Clark:** The Dean's Diversity Task Force is currently inactive. Dr. Clark is working with Allison on a new proposal to get it up and running.
