**APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FROM MEETING 4-38, June 13, 2019**

**FACULTY/STAFF/AUDIENCE INTRODUCTIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

**Jim Allen, Director of Student Success & Registrar Services:** The past few months we have been working closely with Student Government Council (SGC) here at FSU PC to identify and hopefully influence the possibility of enhancing the FSU Career Services on the FSU PC campus. Currently, career services on the FSU PC campus are primarily offered in a virtual format. There are a lot of on-line resources, albeit very effective resources to a certain extent, all of these resources are being provided at a distance to FSU PC students. On the other side of the coin on the FSU Tallahassee campus most of these services are provided face-to-face and they have an established Career Center that provides on-site career advising at all levels. They provide access to online resources, textbooks, different resource materials that help students develop and refine their career plans for post-graduation. They also have a suite of on-campus interview rooms so employers can provide interview opportunities to students on campus in dedicated suites for that purpose. They also are able to host in the neighborhood of 20 different career events on the Tallahassee campus. All of this is housed by the Career Center, with very highly trained career service and career counseling staff, 5 days per week throughout each academic semester. This obviously presents an imbalance between services offered on the Tallahassee campus vs services offered on the Panama City campus. In working with SGC leadership we were provided an opportunity to tour the Career Center in Tallahassee so they could get a snapshot of those differences between the two campuses, and to identify that we are not on an even playing field in terms of career development, career preparedness and career readiness with the Tallahassee campus. A strategic goal of the University is to prepare graduates for 21<sup>st</sup> century careers. We want our FSU graduates to be career ready; that is what equals student success. Graduating from FSU means being successful post-graduation. Again, we have been working with SGC leadership to inform them, inform you as a council, so that you can deliberate and determine if this is something worth a resolution on your part.

**President Pro Tempore Lamb:** Kind of a slow week. Strategic Planning, we didn't do anything these past couple of weeks; we are going to be having a meeting on July 10<sup>th</sup>. I have spoken to Mark about the OneDrive, we are working on it. He has asked for a little time, they are running a lot of cables right now and since it isn't a top priority I figured it would be ok. I will go and talk to him next week to try and get that sorted out. I sent out an email to the RSO's so we should hopefully be getting those binders filled out soon. Quick reminder, we set up binders for all of the different RSO's so that we can keep track of them and that way when they ask for funding or anything we can look and kind of audit them and see what is going on and all that good stuff. I'm going to be talking about what we can do with the \$50,000.00. I'm going to be in Dan's office a lot next week to see what is and isn't possible; so please if you have any additional ideas let me know. Even if you just ask some students, I would appreciate some other ideas. We have a couple of really good ones, but that isn't going to use all of the money.

**Senator Williams:** I had a meeting with Mr. Allen today going over what he just spoke about. One of the things that Billy and I have been working on is the survey aspect and Mr. Allen and I decided that it would be best to survey the upper division students this summer and focus on the freshmen in the fall. We actually talked about printing paper surveys, getting the faculty involved, getting them on board should be really easy to do as our faculty should be vested in our students doing really well and presenting that to their students for a quick 5 minutes in class; let them read it, fill it out, and we think that will be the best response from students. Hiring committee - the candidate that we picked to come out to the campus accepted another offer. The first thought for the hiring committee was to re-post the position, however, I received an email today stating that we were not going to do that and we have been asked to go back through the applicants that have already applied. I will let you know how that's going. I decided on a Bylaw meeting time from 7:00 PM – 8:00 PM on Mondays. I had a meeting with Allison Moon about our SGC meeting times and not having the meeting run so late, and she had a great idea of having all the Agenda items due on Thursday a week before the actual SGC meeting and then have the Agenda sent out with all the information on Friday. The week of the SGC meetings it would be up to the council members to do their research on what is on the Agenda and also poll students because we are representatives; it shouldn't just be what I think is best, but we should really be representing the student body. We would simply meet, introduce the Bill and go into voting. We have filled our SABA Board now. We are going to be moving forward with some team-building with SABA and get the ball rolling before the end of summer so we can really hit hard as soon as fall starts.
